### Church Remodel





### MEMBER'S VOICE

Joshua Bell's interest in music was noted by his parents when, at three, he used rubber band "strings" to play songs he heard on his parents' records. He was a

child prodigy on the violin; he first played Carnegie Hall at seventeen. In January of 2007, a little before his fortieth birthday, he agreed to take part in a social experiment for a Washington D.C. newspaper. What would happen if one of the world's best violinists, dressed as an ordinary street musician in a busy metro station, and performed one of the most difficult pieces of music ever written? He played his priceless Stradivarius for a little less than an hour while 1000 people walked past. Only seven people stopped for more than a minute to listen. Concert hall tickets for his performances averaged \$100; that day there was \$32.17 in the case at his feet. Perhaps he learned a lesson in humility. As my finger points at him, I immediately feel the three pointing back at me. Busted! Most days I am a part of that busy crowd, oblivious to The Creator of the Universe and the tune He is playing. It is a love song that holds blessings for me.

Yet there is a further observation in this social experiment that deserves our attention. Most of the children who passed Mr. Bell were captivated by the man playing but were tugged away by their accompanying adult. The scripture comes to mind:

Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." Matthew 19:14

Is the lesson: Don't tug on children? In part, but more, it is to find a child to observe, identify those positive characteristics that Jesus was referring to, and emulate them!

### Where Are You Going?

Our conference has released our upcoming ACTS team mission trips from 2025. "ACTS" stands for Advancing Christ Through Service. These short-term intergenerational mission trips give opportunities for members to grow closer to God, experience the





Gospel at work in different cultures and see missions as part of everyday life.

ACTS Teams are unique, in that the strengths & giftings of the individual team members are utilized to develop the trip itinerary. There are three trips planned for 2025. The first trip is to Vera Cruz, Mexico from June 24th - July 2nd. The Second trip is to the Dominican Republic from June 25th - July 2nd.

Both of these trips cost \$1750. Pastor Kevin and Kelly will be joining the trip to the DR.

The third mission trip is to the Southwest/Navajo region in the USA. The cost for this trip is \$1300 and is an excellent opportunity for anyone new to mission trips. The deadline for these trips are March 15th. Finally, there are possibilities to design a mission trip to other areas as well. If there is a mission field that interests you, please come talk to pastor Kevin or Bobbi Jo Barbee (President of the mission Committee) and let us see what we can do.

Finally, Don't ever let the cost keep you from serving. Ney Church of God has a mission fund that is able to help pay a portion of this cost. There are also several people willing to help you raise funds to ensure those who wish to go, can go take advantage of these opportunities.




### Free Bibles
